Having studied at various drama Institutes in New York and performed in a off - Broadway production of Sam Shepard's True West. Mark returned to Melbourne and has since earned great acclaim in sold out productions such as David Mamet's Pulitzer Prizes winning play 'Glengarry Glen Ross' Stephen Aldy Guirgis 'The last days of Judas Iscariot', the classic 'One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest', 'Killer Joe' and recently with 'The Long Red Road' at fortyfive downstairs.

In 2012 Mark along with follow actors Noni Hazelhurst, Marg Downey and Chris Bunsworth co-founded the ensemble actors theatre company The KIN Collective and premiered their debut production 'Glimpse' and followed up with 'The Lonesome West' as part of the Leenane Trilogy'.

His film credits include 'Vessel', 'Dostoevsky' - Crime & Punishment' and the soon to begin filming 'Slient Night'. 'Motherless Melbourne' is loosely adapted from Mark's next film set in the backdrop of Melbourne's nightclub culture titled 'Door Man'.

Michala's acting career started very early, with her first film credit at the age of 5, in her native New Zealand. Since then, she has forged a remarkable film and television career. After moving to Australia 25 years ago, Michala worked on several productions before her breakout role as Marissa Taylor in "Always Greener" (CH 7). "Scooby Doo", "McLeods Daughters" (CH 9), "Ned", and "Winners and Losers" (CH 7) soon followed. She portrayed Todd Russell's wife, Carolyn, in the telemovie true story of "Beaconsfield" (CH 9) to much acclaim. Along with several stints in radio, Michala has been seen as a presenter on popular talk show "The Circle" (CH 10), and has featured on several occasions on "The Project" (CH10), "Dirty Laundry Live' (ABC) and "Have You Been Paying Attention" (CH10). Her portrayal of two naughty puppets in her stage debut in "Avenue Q" in 2009, earned Michala a Helpmann award for Best lead female in a Musical in 2010. Her latest TV role is as the feisty Amber Wheeler, in the ABC comedy series "Upper Middle Bogan". Most recently, she made her MTC debut in "Birldland" by Simon Stephens, portraying multiple characters with multiple accents, and she also just completed filming on "nowhere Boys" the movie.



As one of Australia's leading comedy actors, Marg is best known for the numerous characters she brilliantly portrayed on comedy series FAST FORWARD. Marg has also been applauded for the dramatic roles she has undertaken for television and theatre. Marg first appeared on television as part of THE D-GENERATION in the late 1980s and subsequently appeared reqularly in FAST FORWARD, FULL FRONTAL, SOMETHING STUPID and KATH AND KIM alongside several of her D-Gen alumni. Marg has also appeared in the popular dramas THE DOCTOR BLAKE MYSTERIES (Series 2 & 3), HOUSE HUSBANDS and CITY HOMICIDE. Theatre credits include MOONLIGHT AND MAGNOLIAS for director Bruce Beresford at the Melbourne Theatre Company, MUM'S THE WORD and MUM'S THE WORD 2, GLIMPSE and the world premier season of Joanna Murray-Smith's RAPTURE for Playbox. In 2013 she performed at the Melbourne Theatre Company for their premiere of David Williamson's new play RUPERT, which also toured to Washington in March 2014 as part of the Kennedy Center's World Stages: International Theatre Festival. Marg most recently played the role of Mary John Rafferty in SKULL IN CONNEMARA at 45 Downstairs and Marie Dindon in LA CAGE AUX FOLLES for The Production Company. So far in 2015 Marg has appeared in TIMESHARE at the Malthouse Theatre and OPEN SLATHER, a new sketch comedy series for Foxtel.

On screen he feaures as Porfiry in an upcoming independent film adaptation of Dostoevsky's Crime and Punishment. Throughout 2015, he continues to tour with Arena Theatre Company in their critically acclaimed sea-faring adventure Marlin.Chris trained at Dell' Arte International School of Physical Theatre in Blue Lake, California He has been a proud member of Actor's Equity since 2002 and is a committee member of the Victorian Actor's Benevolent Trust (VABT)

A series regular in the ABC cult hit The Librarians, for which the cast won Best Comedy Ensemble at the 2011 Equity Awards, Keith has appeared in Rush, The Time of Our Lives, Bruce Lee Played Badminton Too, Warren and Hal, and Verite. In addition to being a founding member of The Kin Collective, Keith is a long-time collaborator with Melbourne-based theatre company 15 Minutes from Anywhere, and will be performing in their upcoming production of The Yellow Wave, part of the inaugural Poppy Seed Festival in December.
